The official governing body of Navarro College is the Board of Trustees. The Board is composed of seven members who are residents of the college taxing district (Navarro County) and are elected for six-year terms by the qualified voters for the district. They exercise fiduciary oversight of the institution and ensure the College District achieves its full potential within its role and mission, vision, and values. The Board of Trustees meets monthly to review and take action on college policy and procedures.

Navarro College has four Vice Presidents that work directly with the District President to advance the mission and academic goals of the institution. Their leadership and collaboration foster an inclusive, dynamic environment that promotes student success and community engagement.

History of the College

In spring of 1946, a group of local citizens met to form a steering committee for the purpose of establishing a junior college in Navarro County. In a general election held on July 16, 1946, voters approved the creation of Navarro Junior College and authorized a county tax to help finance the institution. In that same election voters chose a seven-member board of trustees to govern the college. The first students began classes in September 1946. Most of the 238 members of that first student body were returning veterans from World War II taking advantage of assistance available under the newly enacted GI Bill®. The first location of Navarro College was the site of the Air Activities of Texas; a World War II primary flight school located six miles south of Corsicana.

In 1951, the campus was moved to its present location, a 47-acre tract west of downtown Corsicana on State Highway 31. The main campus has now expanded to 103 acres with dozens of buildings. In 1954, Navarro College was accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SASCOC). The accreditation was reaffirmed in 1964, 1974, 1985, 1995, 2006, and again in 2017. Navarro College is accredited by SACSCOC to award associate and baccalaureate degrees. Navarro College may also offer credentials such as certificates and diplomas at approved degree levels.

In 1974, the college broadened its philosophy and purpose to encompass the comprehensive community-based educational concept, adding occupational education programs and implementing new education concepts including individualized and self-paced instruction and the use of audio-tutorial instructional media. In keeping with the new educational role, the word “junior” was dropped from the institution’s name, and the official name Navarro College was adopted by the Board of Trustees.

To address the growing needs of its service area, which consists of Navarro, Ellis, Freestone, Limestone, and Leon counties, the college began offering courses in various locations in those areas. Therefore, Navarro College established two permanent centers, the Navarro College South at Mexia and the Ellis County Center at Waxahachie. Later, a third center was added in Midlothian. Today, the internet is the fastest-growing area of instruction at Navarro. We now also offer hundreds of internet courses each semester. Navarro College truly offers the ways and means for every student to reach his/her educational goals

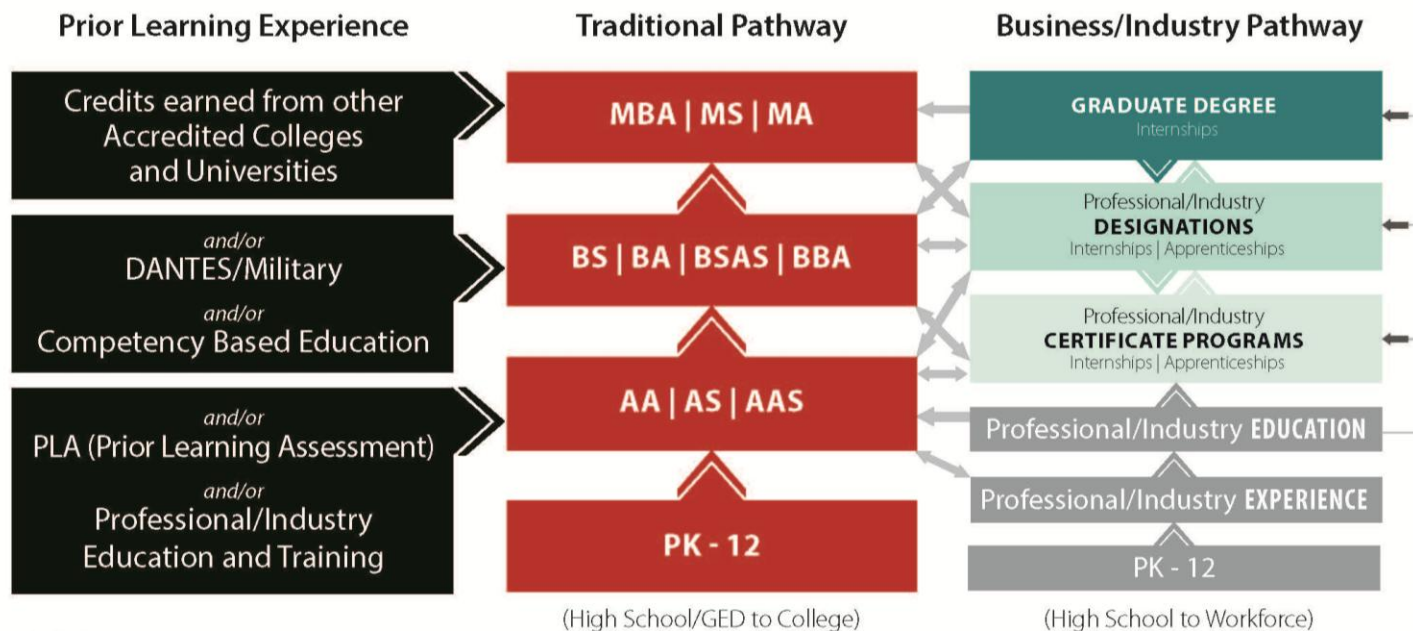

Navarro College Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP)

Navarro College's QEP, **RISE** (Reaching for Inspiration, Success, and Excellence), is a strategic initiative to improve student success through structured academic and personal development support. Rooted in broad-based research and campus-wide collaboration, RISE addresses key challenges students face, including time management, study skills, financial literacy, and understanding of college expectations. Navarro College developed a student success program and a non-credit-based course to provide highly accessible and flexible support to students.

Two-Phase Approach:

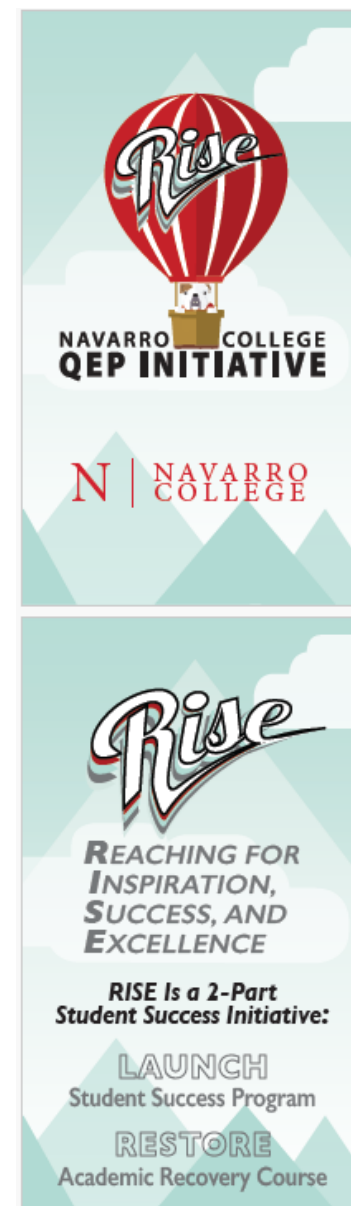
1. Launch (Student Success Program), Beginning Fall 2025:

- a. Voluntary and open to first-time college students and those returning after an extended absence.
- b. Focuses on proactive guidance in academic success strategies, career exploration, goal setting, and financial literacy.

2. Restore (Academic Recovery Course), Beginning Fall 2026:

- a. Required for students on academic suspension.
- b. Offers structured classes that cover topics such as study skills development, time management, writing, test-taking strategies, and effective use of campus resources to support students in regaining academic standing.

By implementing this two-phase approach, **RISE** ensures all students, whether seeking guidance or requiring intervention, receive the tools and support necessary to succeed in college and beyond. 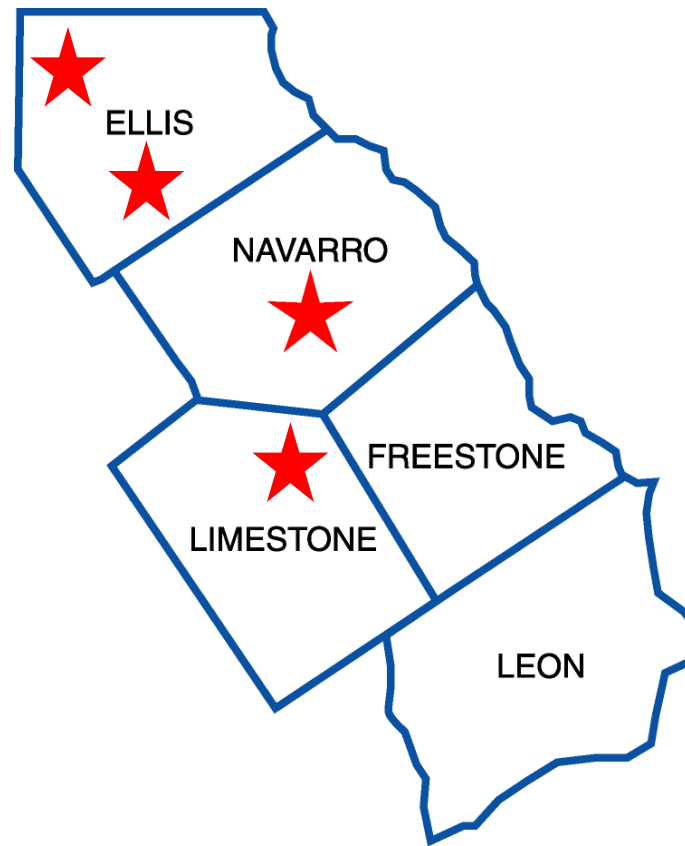

NAVARRO COLLEGE LOCATIONS

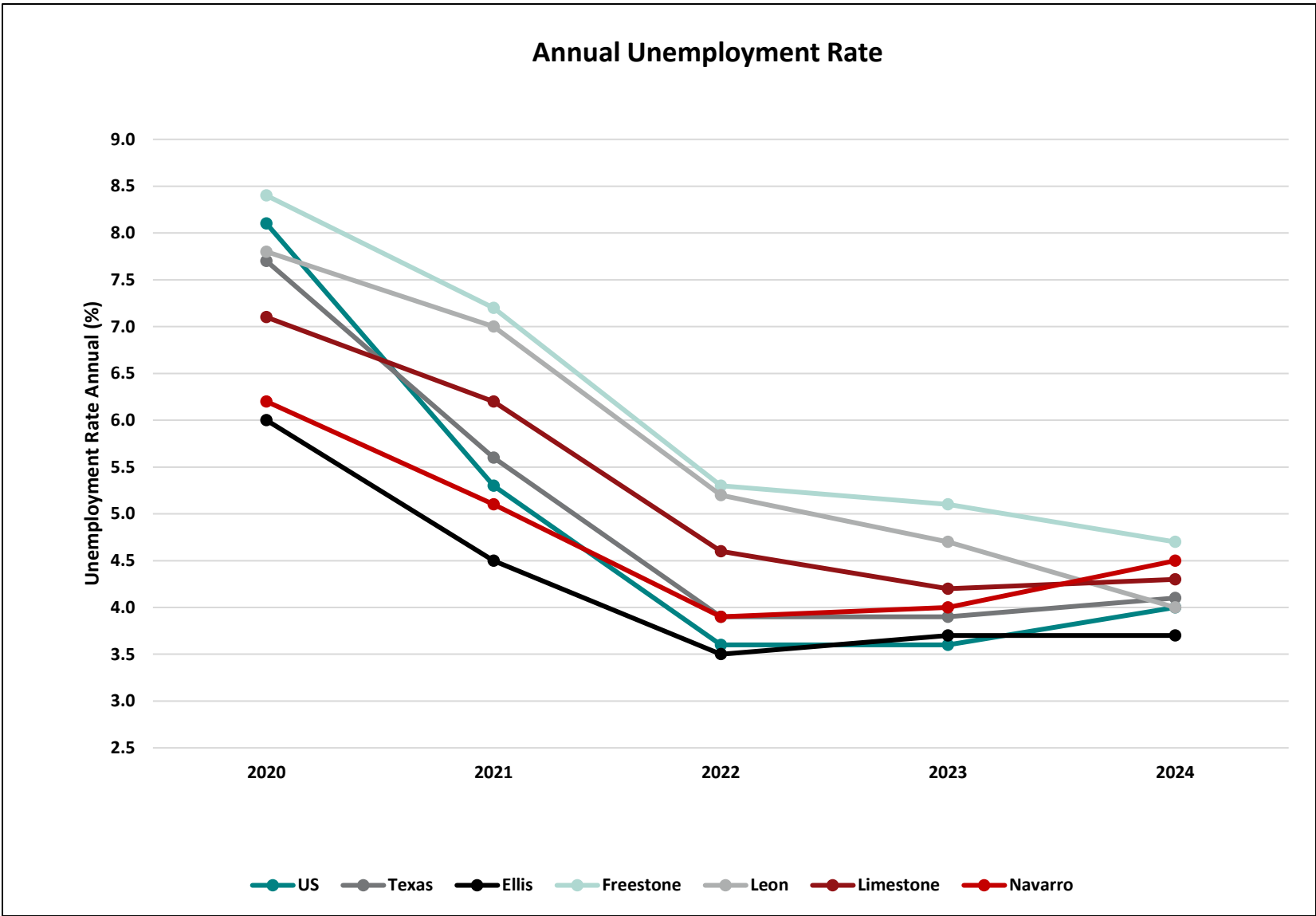

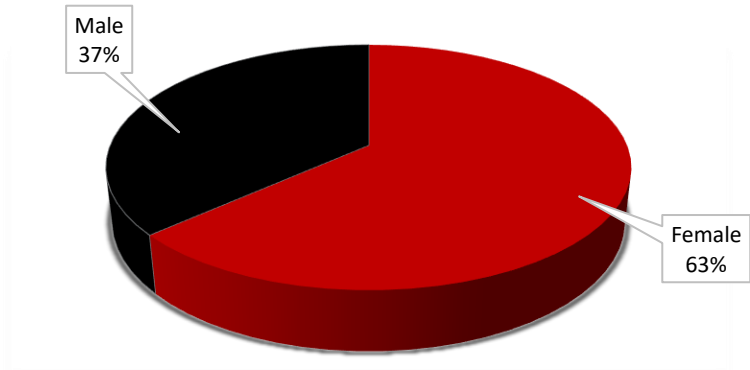

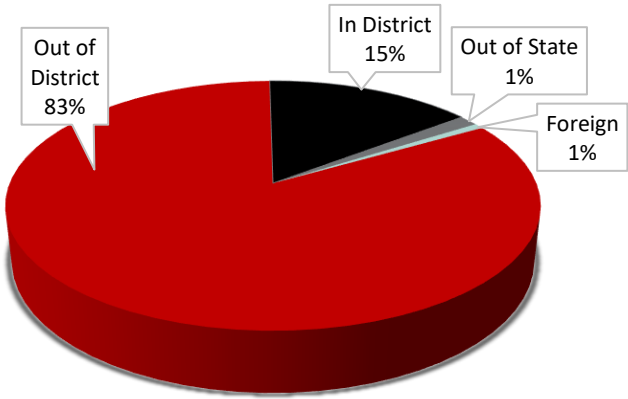

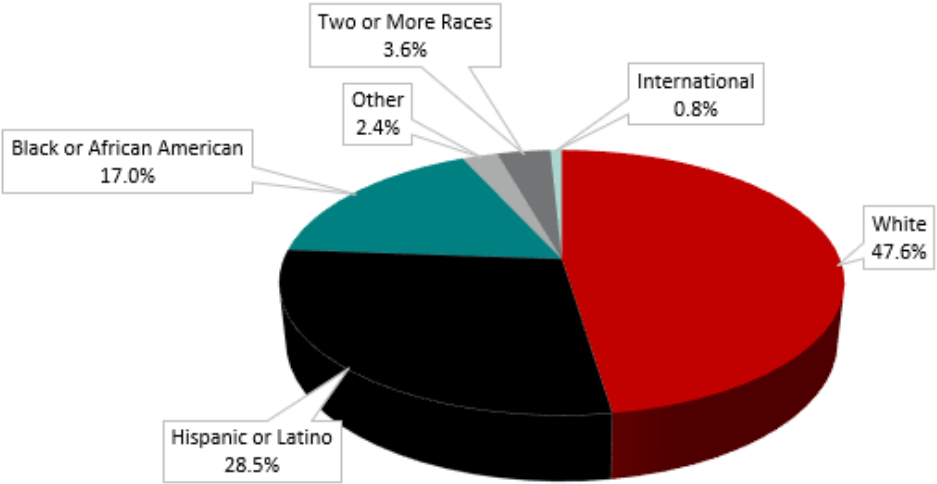

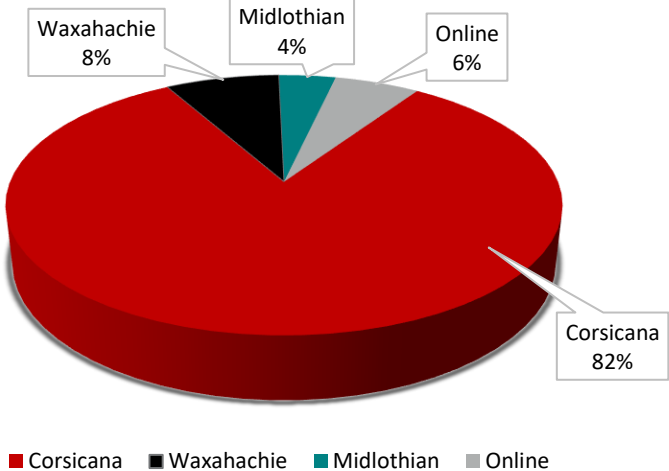

Student Demographics Fall 2024

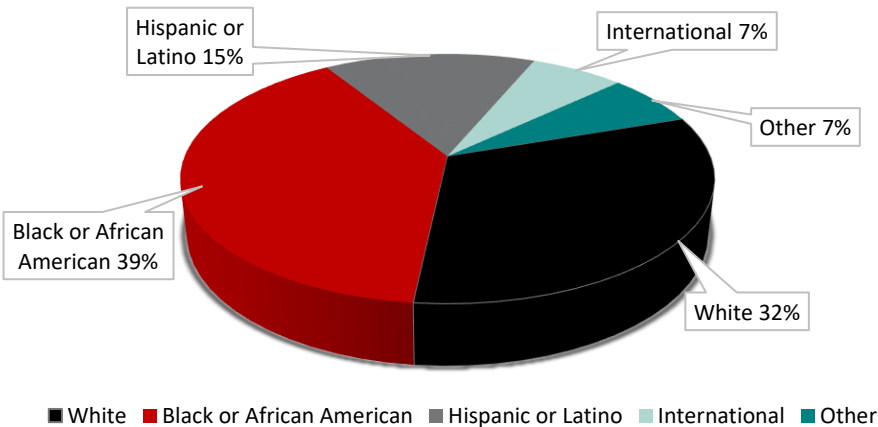
Student Age Group



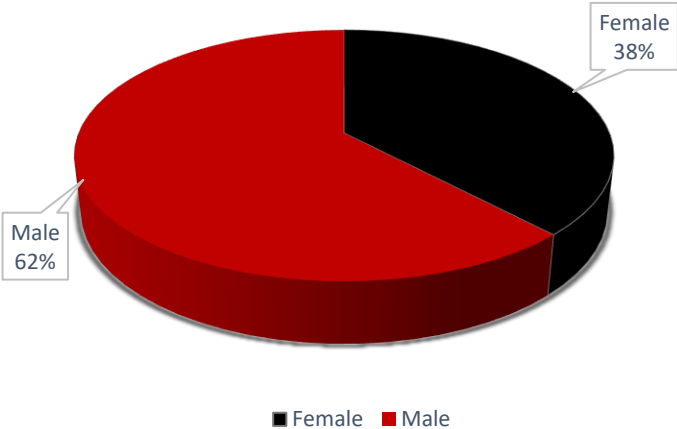

Residence Life Ethnicity

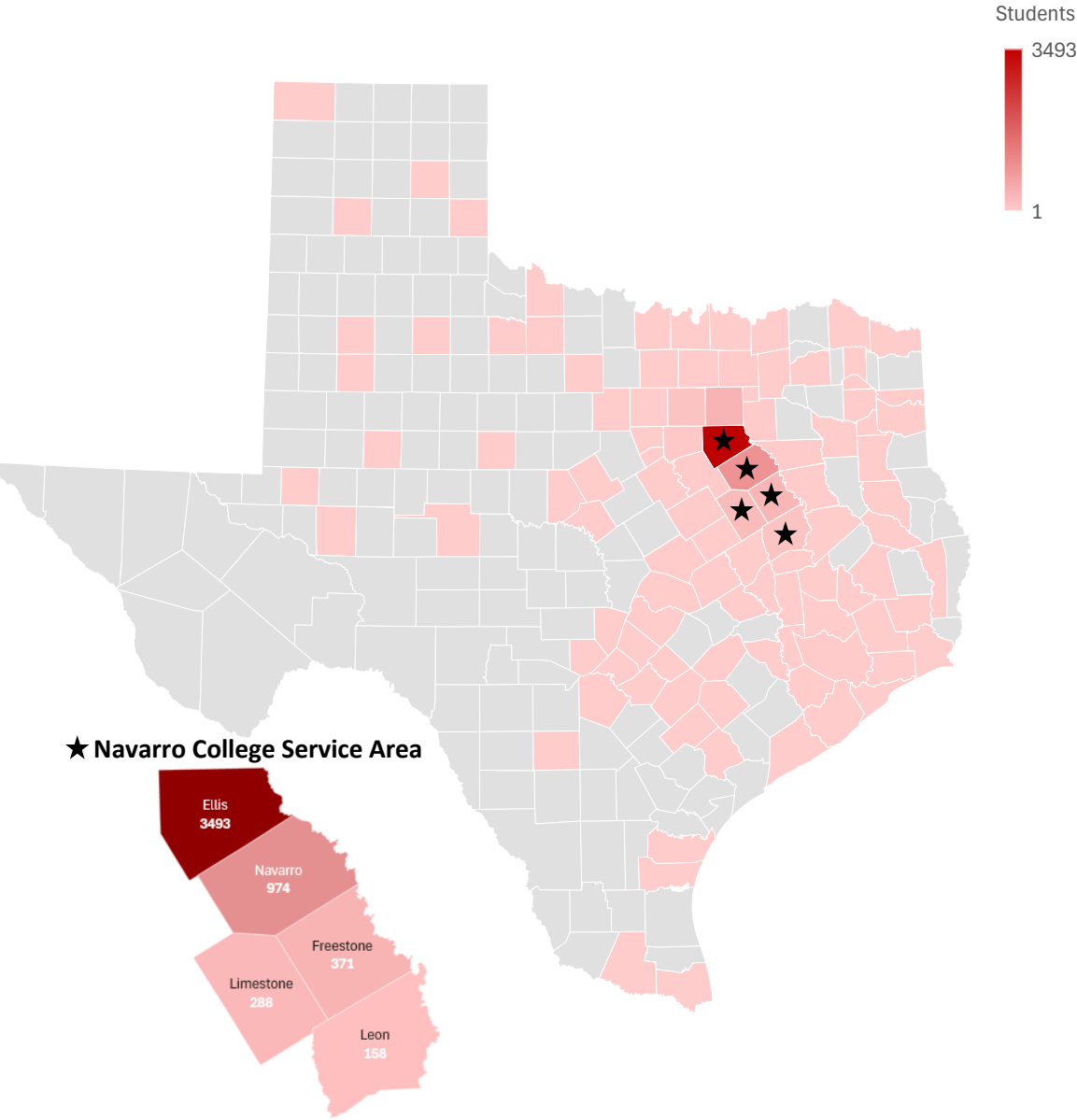


Residence Life Gender

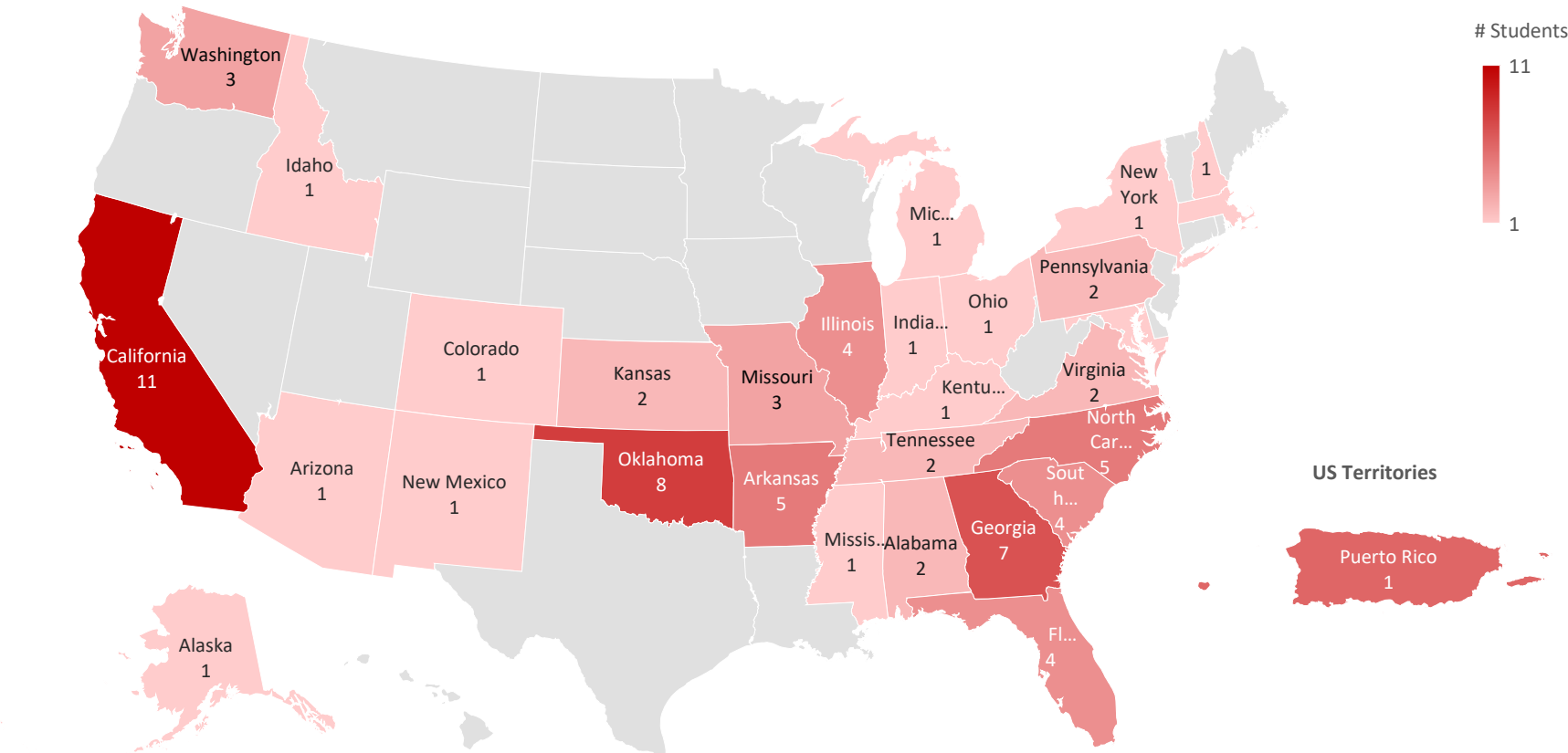

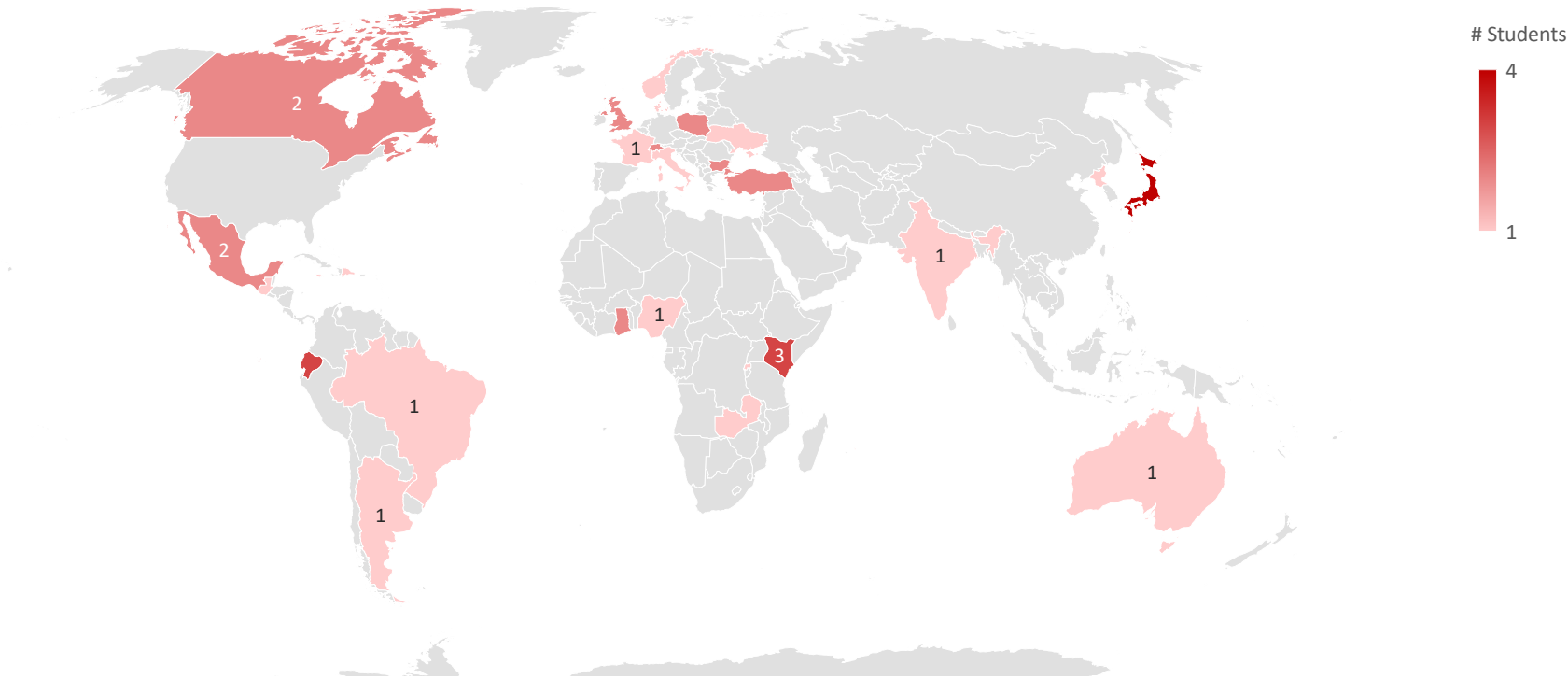

District-wide Annual Headcount

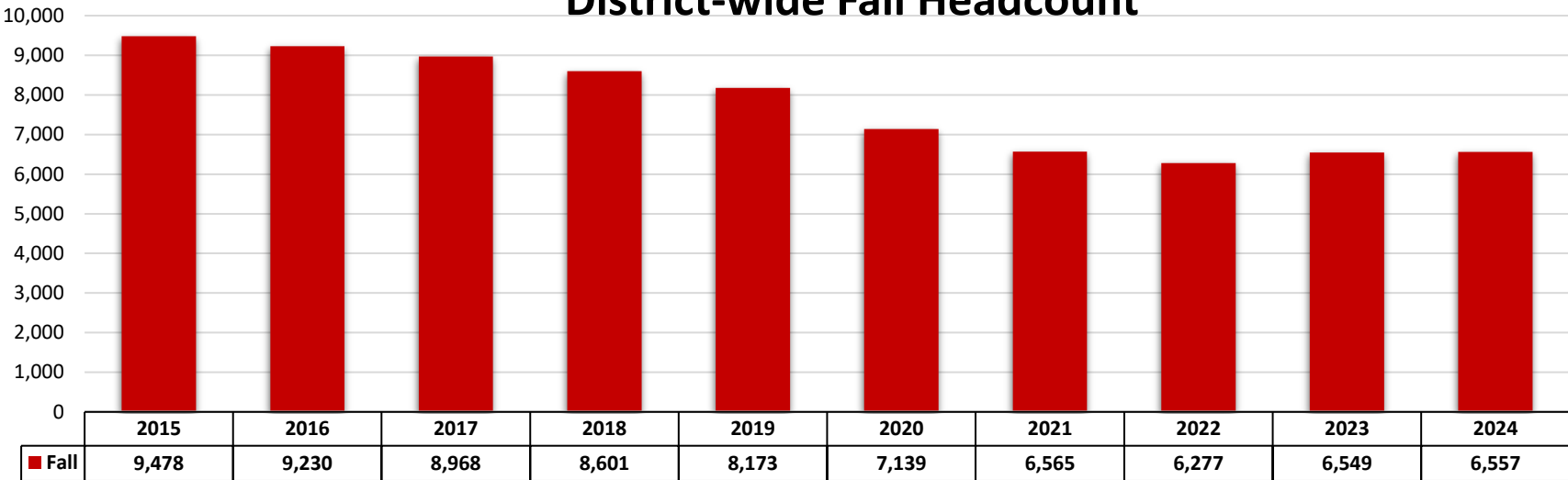


District-wide Annual Contact Hours

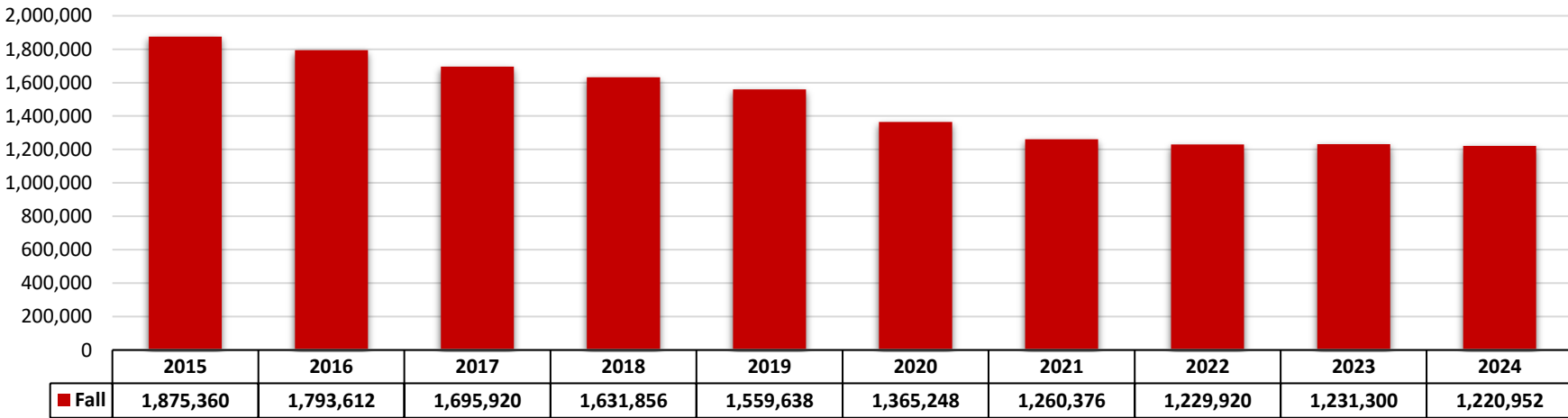

District-wide Fall Headcount

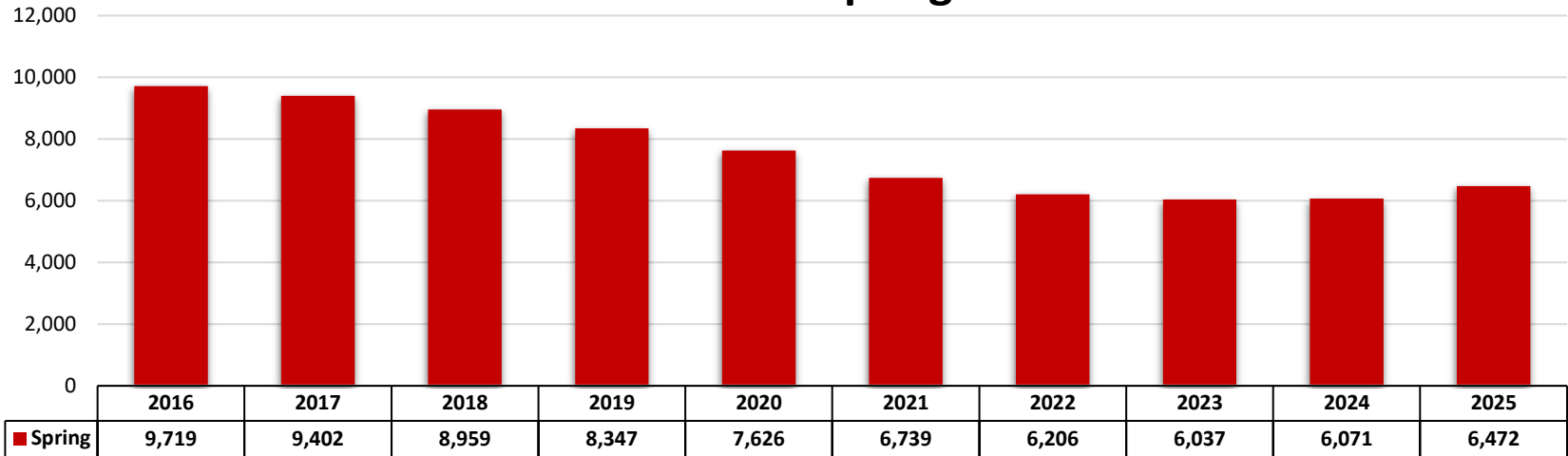


District-wide Fall Contact Hours

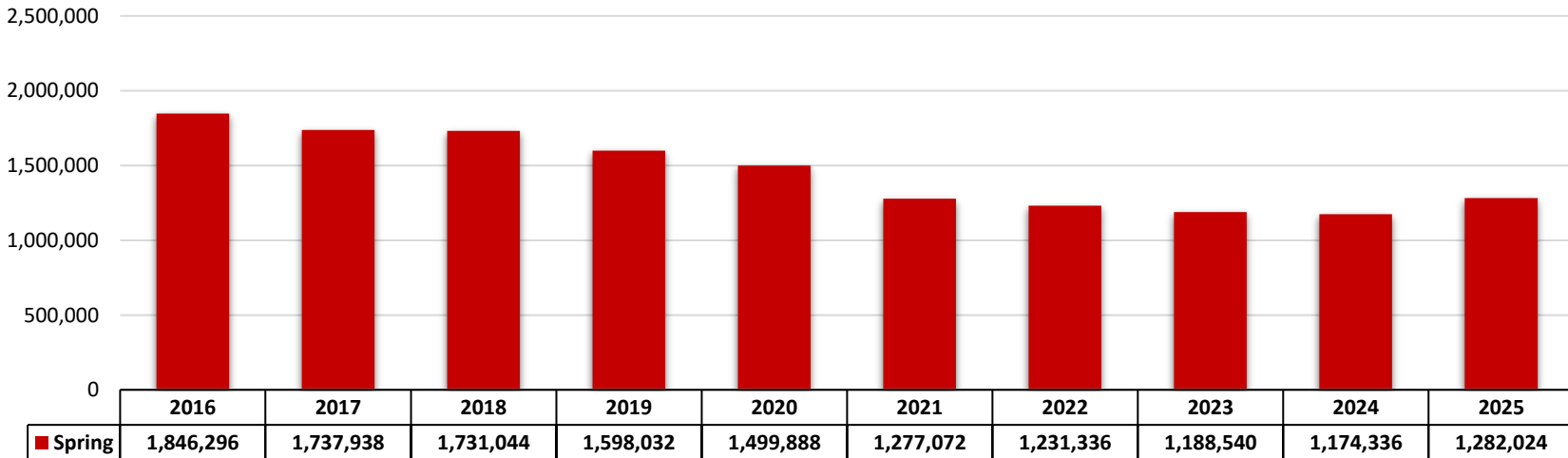

District-wide Spring Headcount

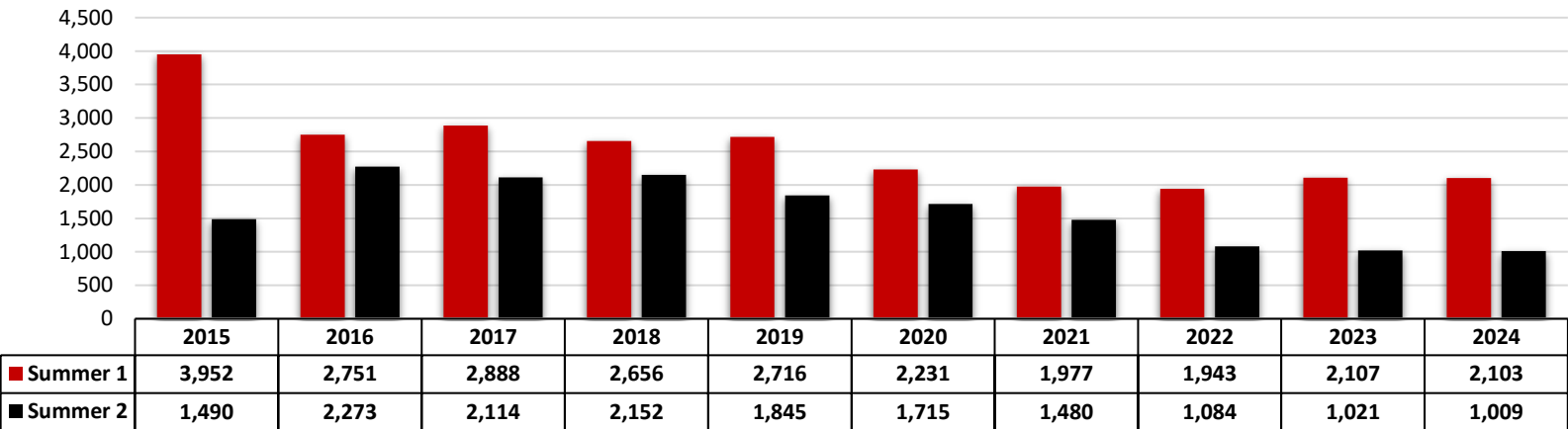

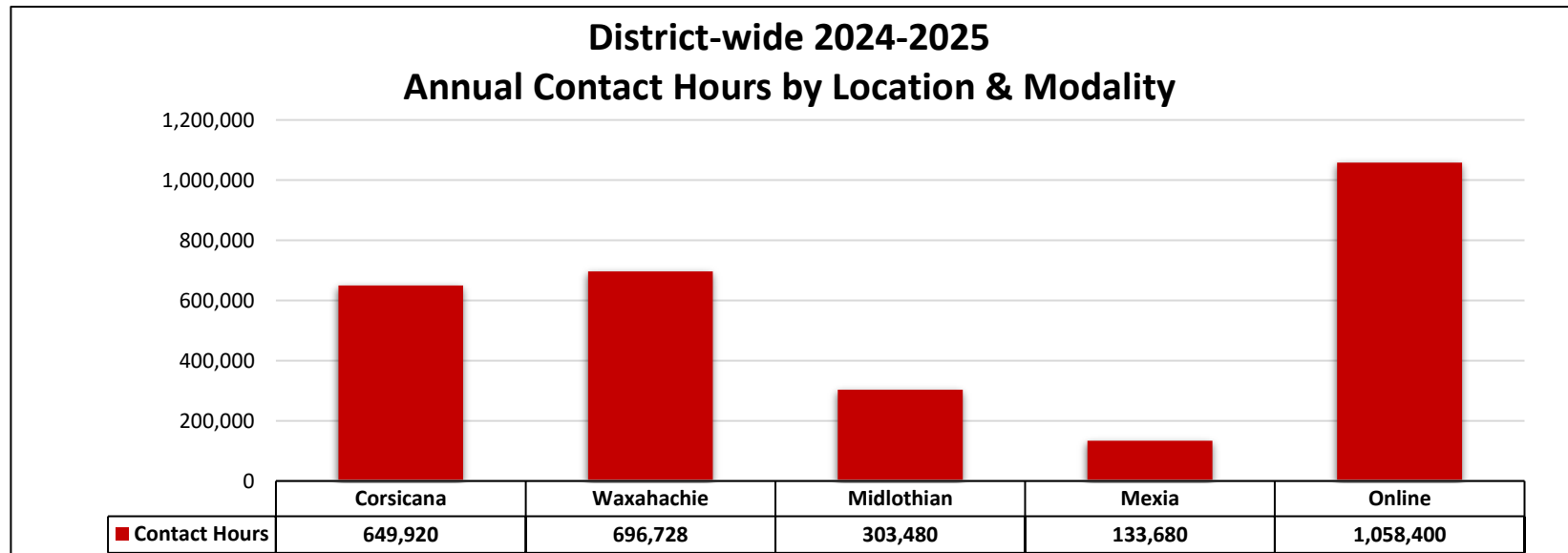
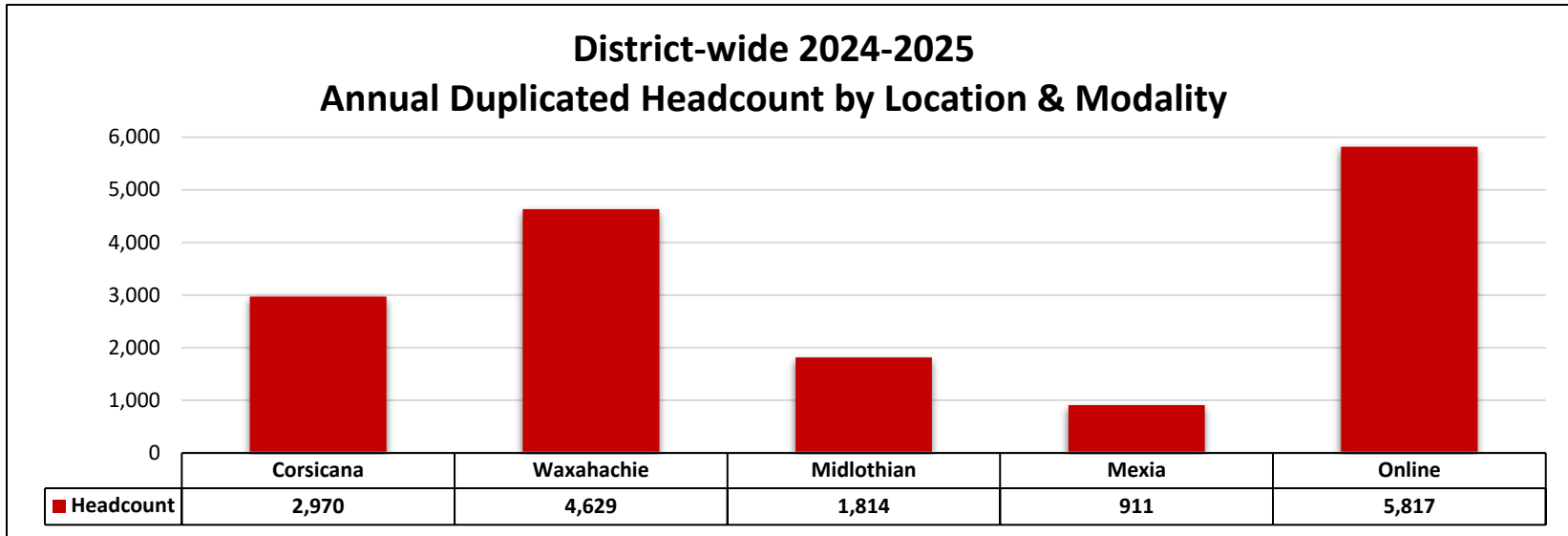
District-wide Summer Headcount

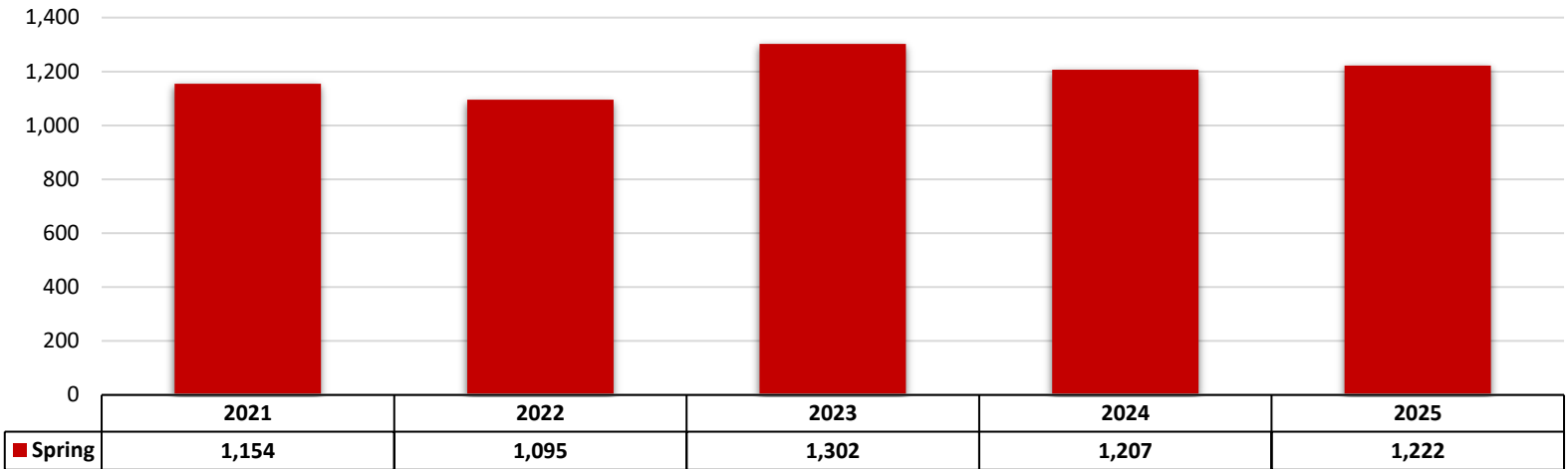

Corsicana Spring Unduplicated Headcount

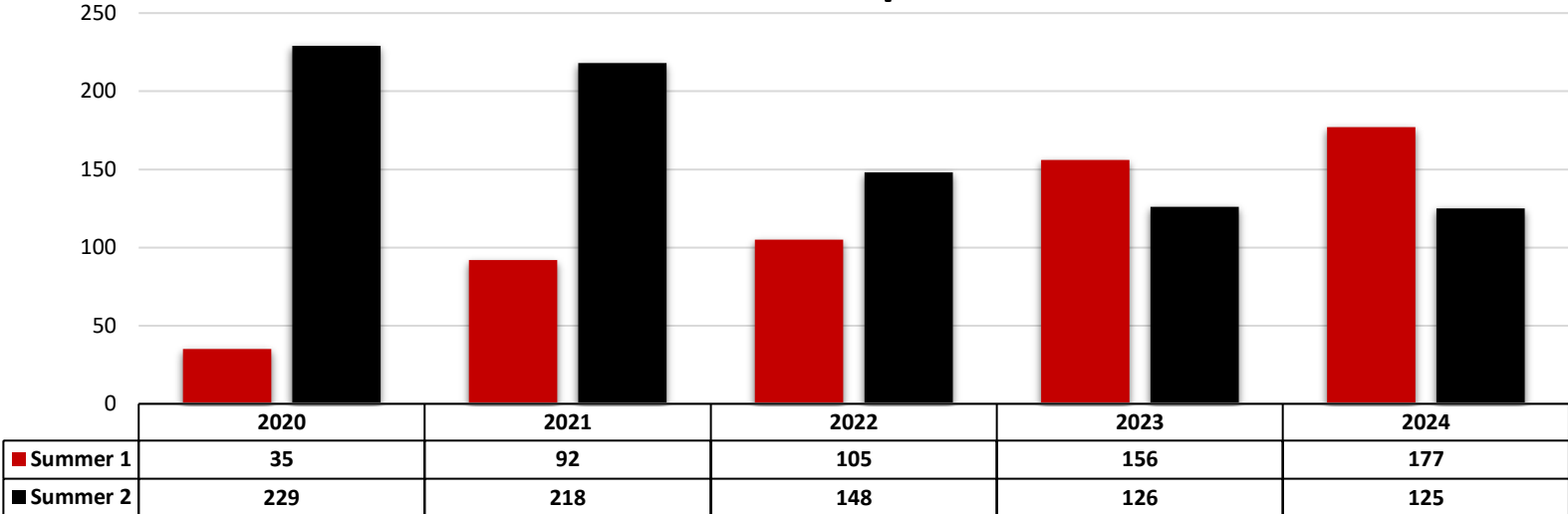

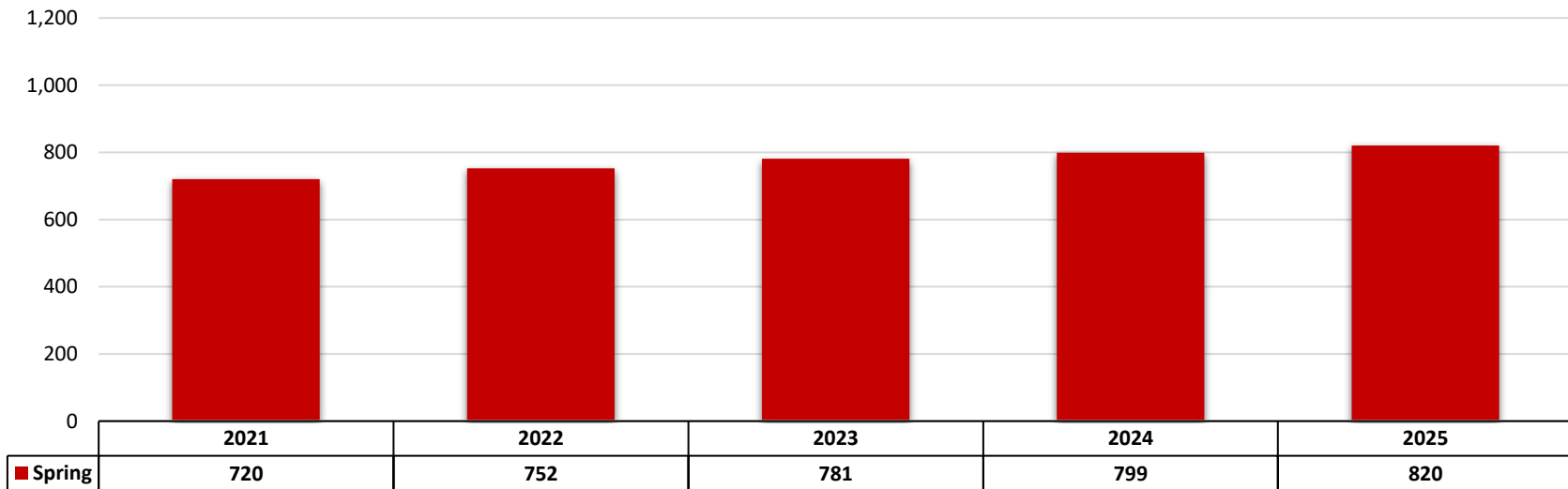

Midlothian Spring Unduplicated Headcount

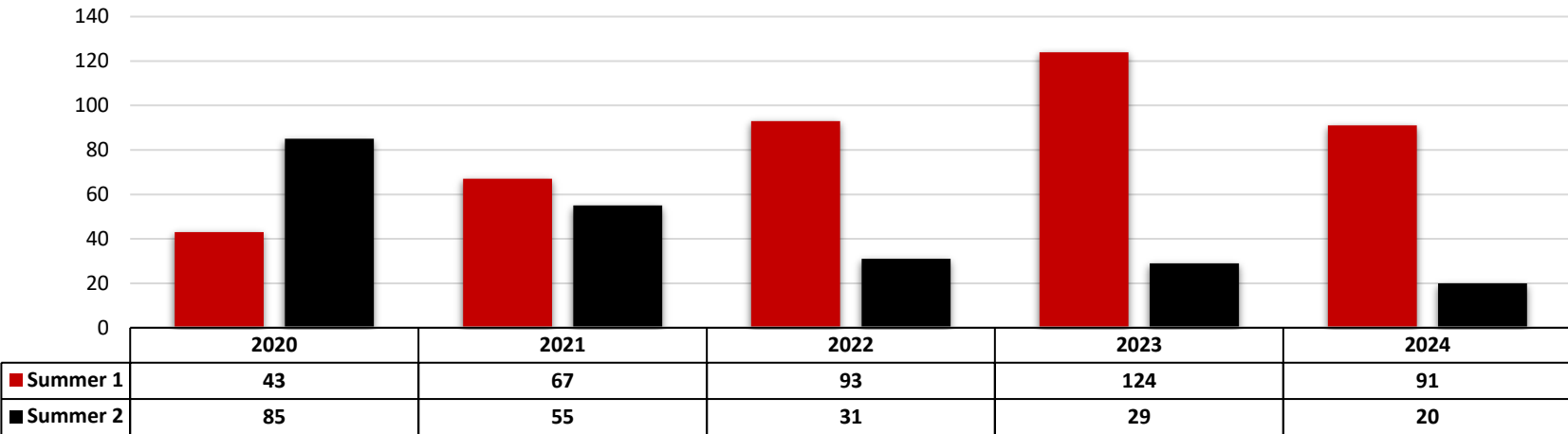

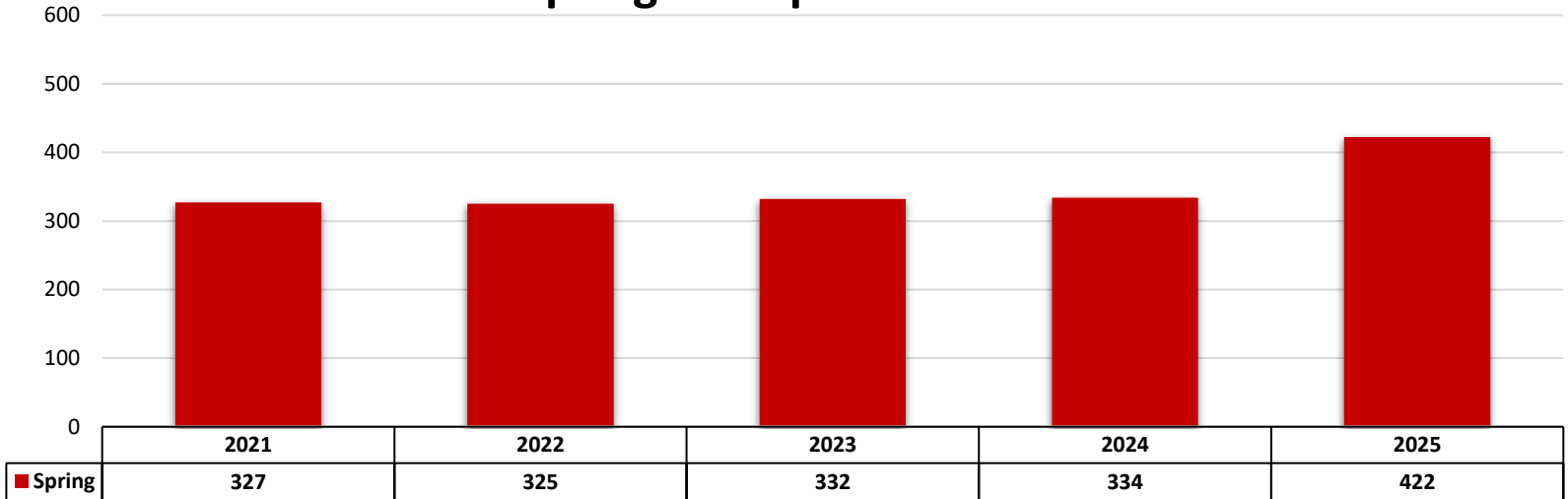

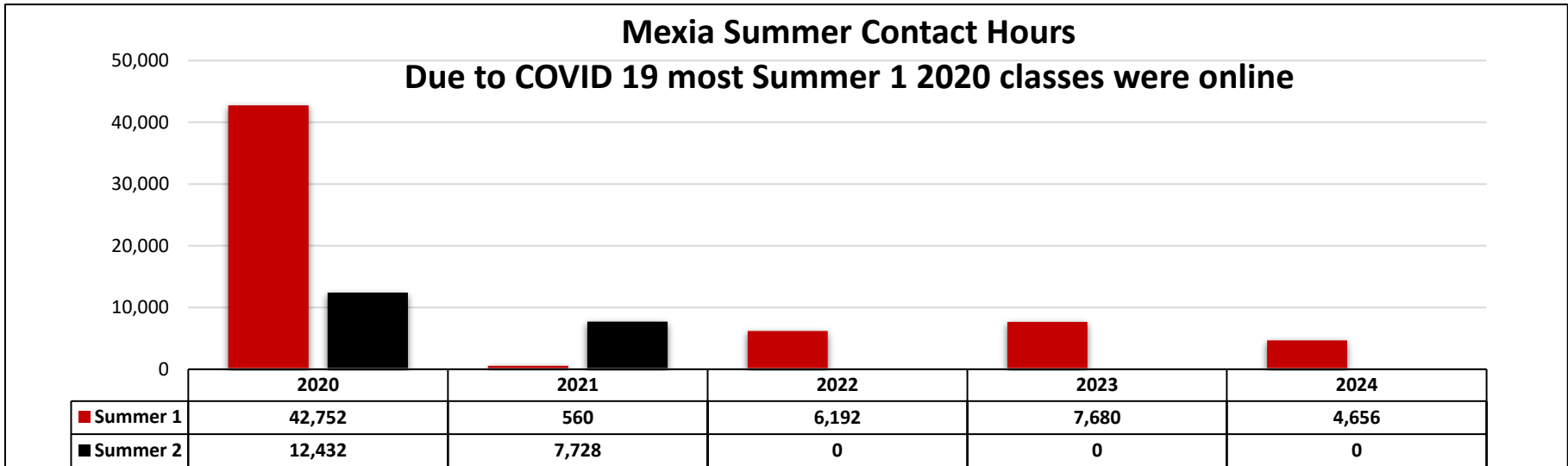
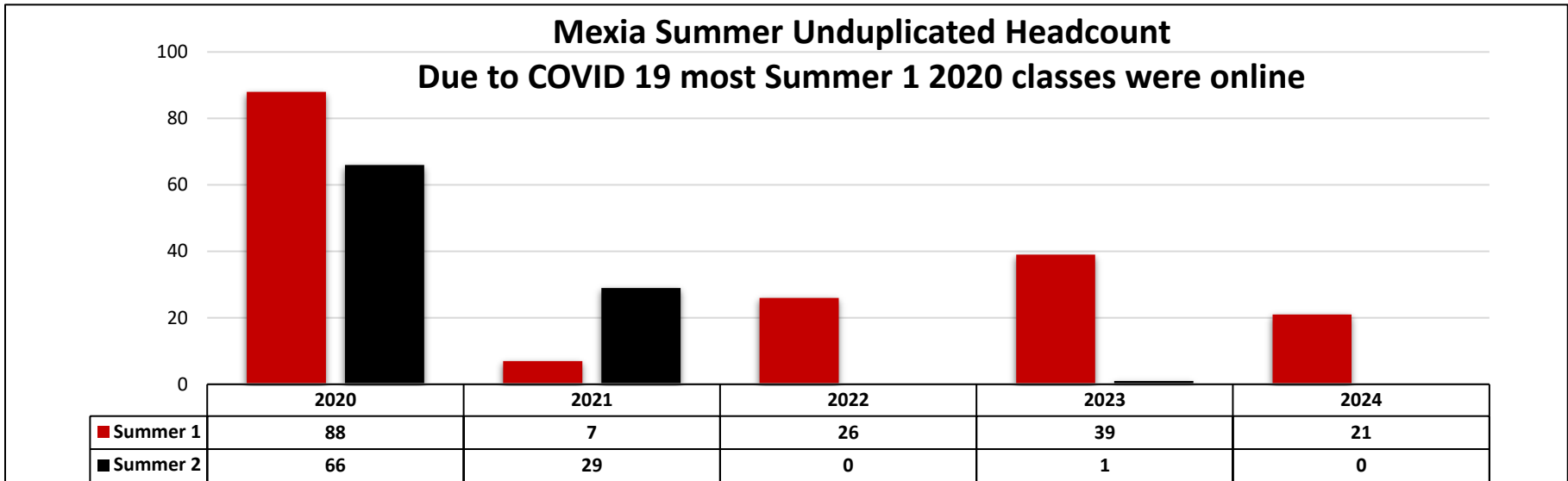
Mexia Spring Unduplicated Headcount

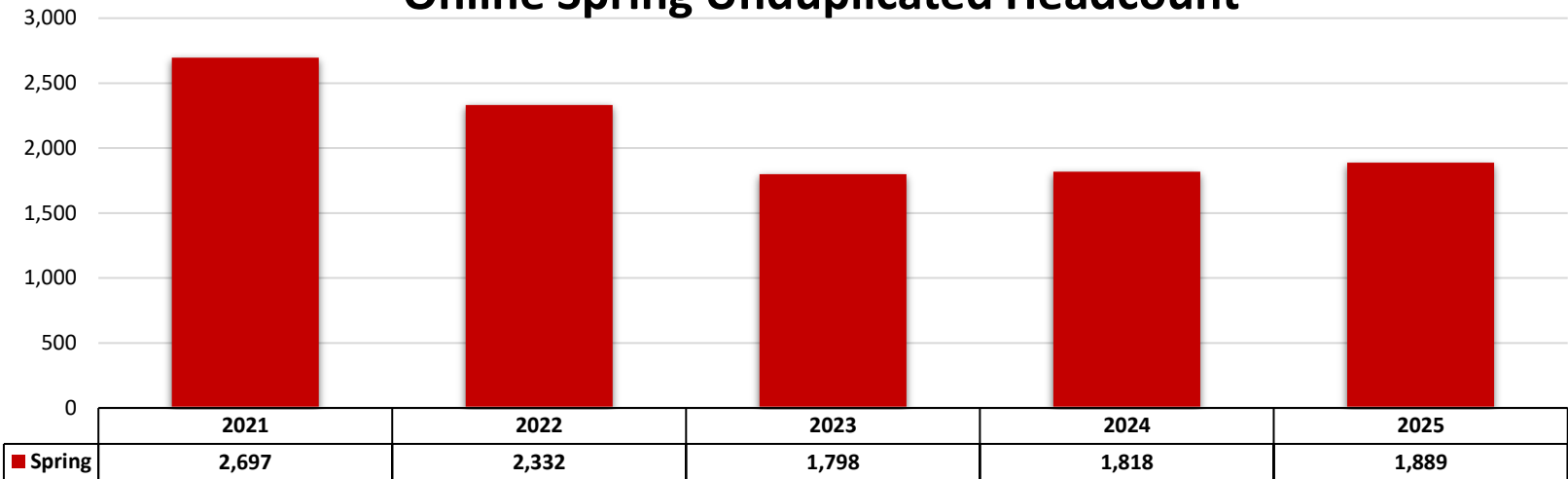

Online Spring Unduplicated Headcount

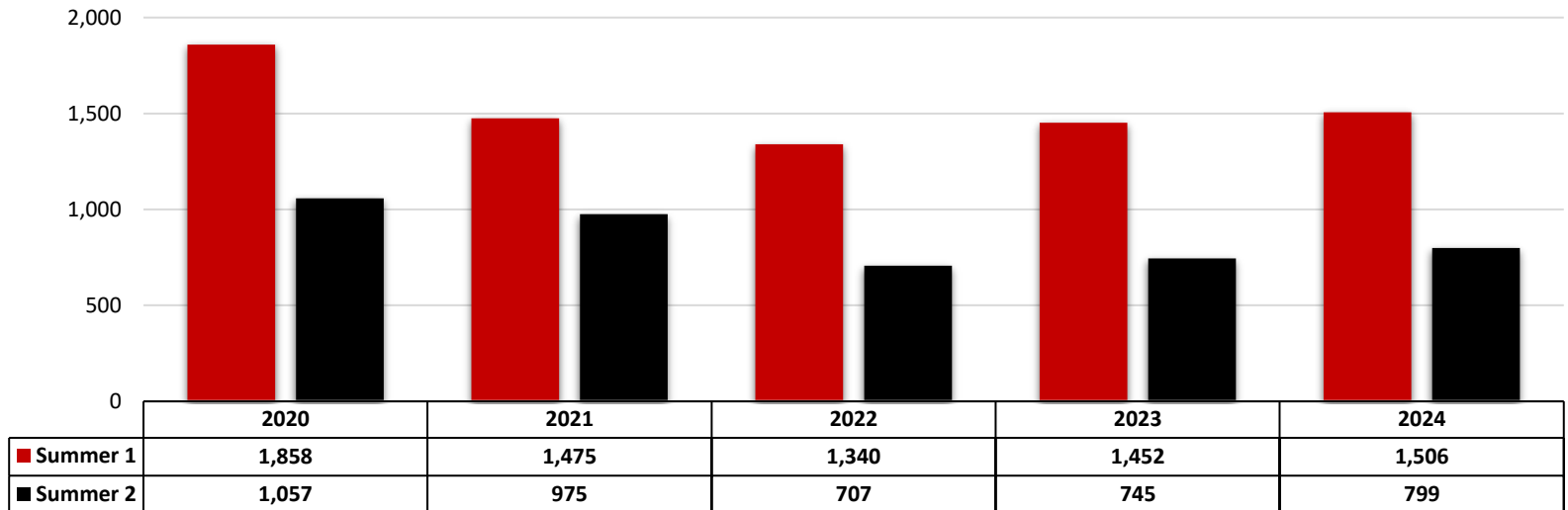

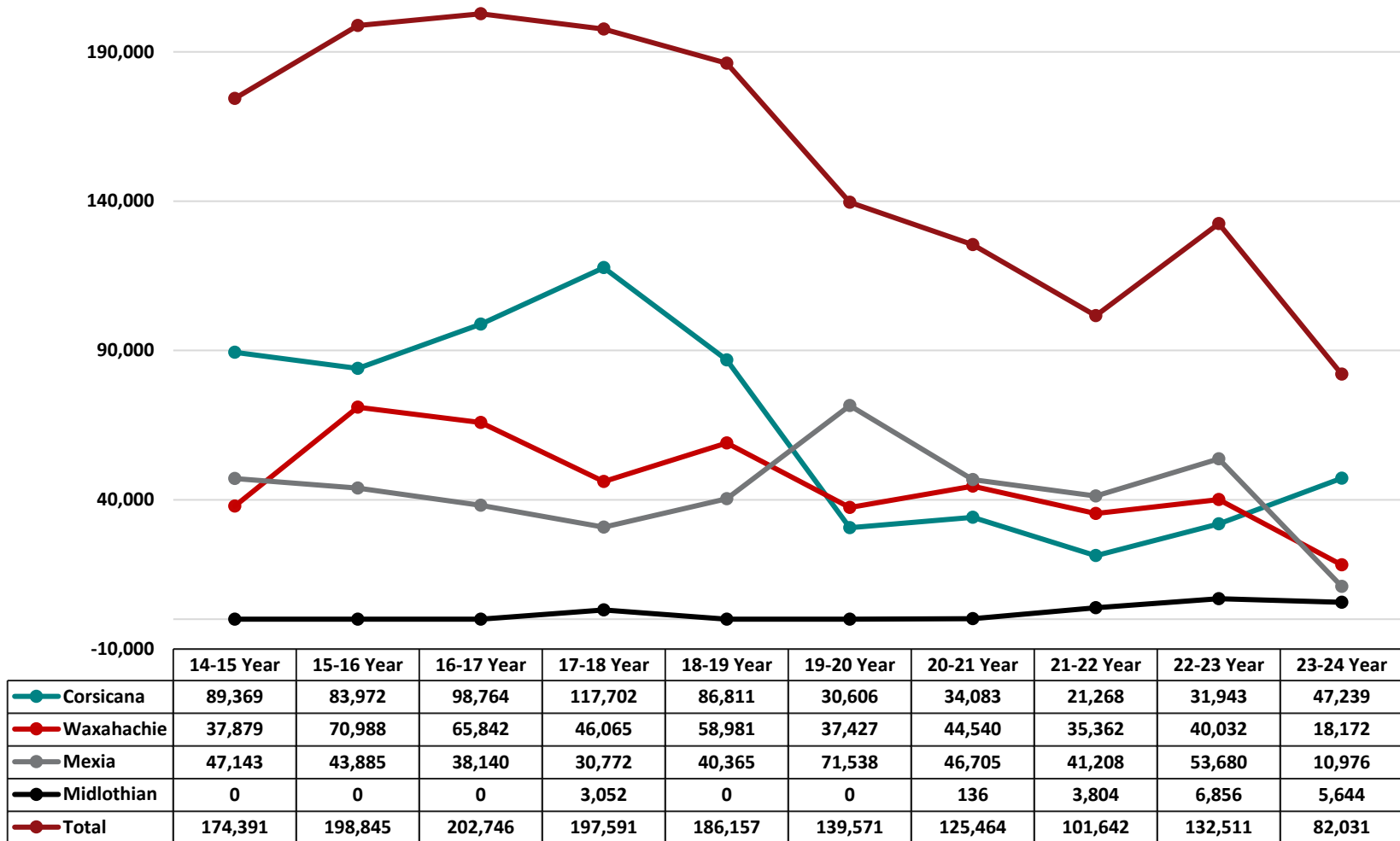

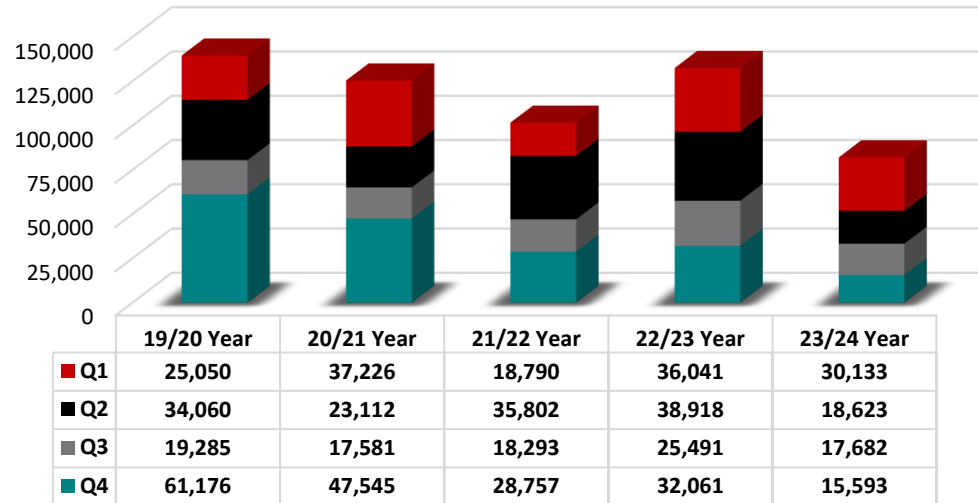

Continuing Education - 10 Year Trend of Annual Contact Hours by Location

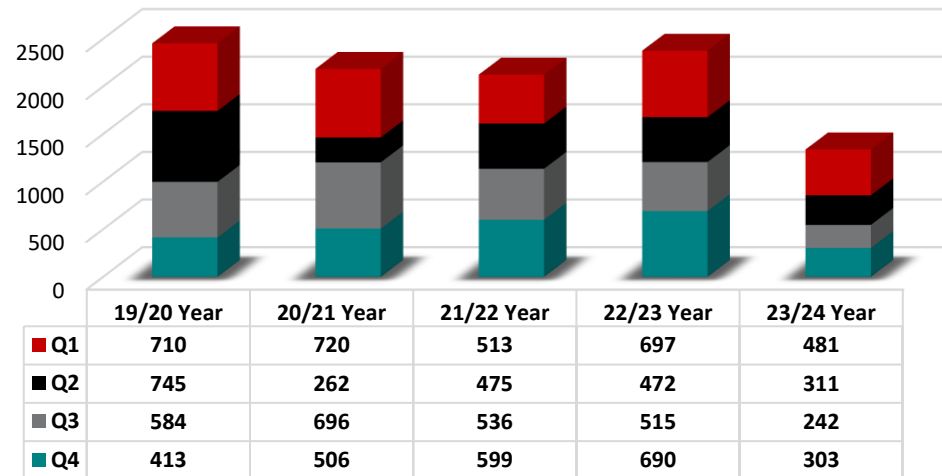

Continuing Education Annual Headcount

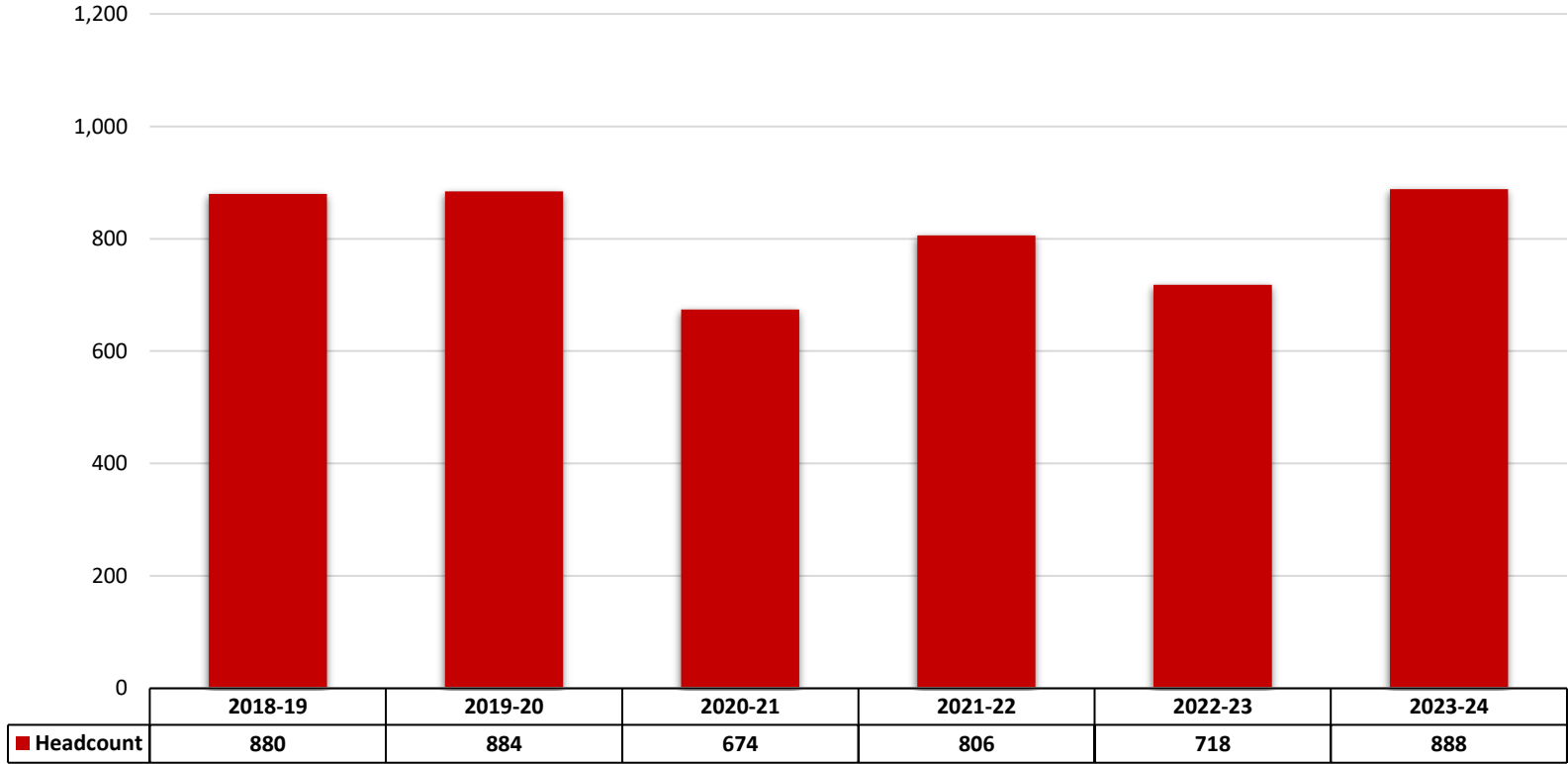

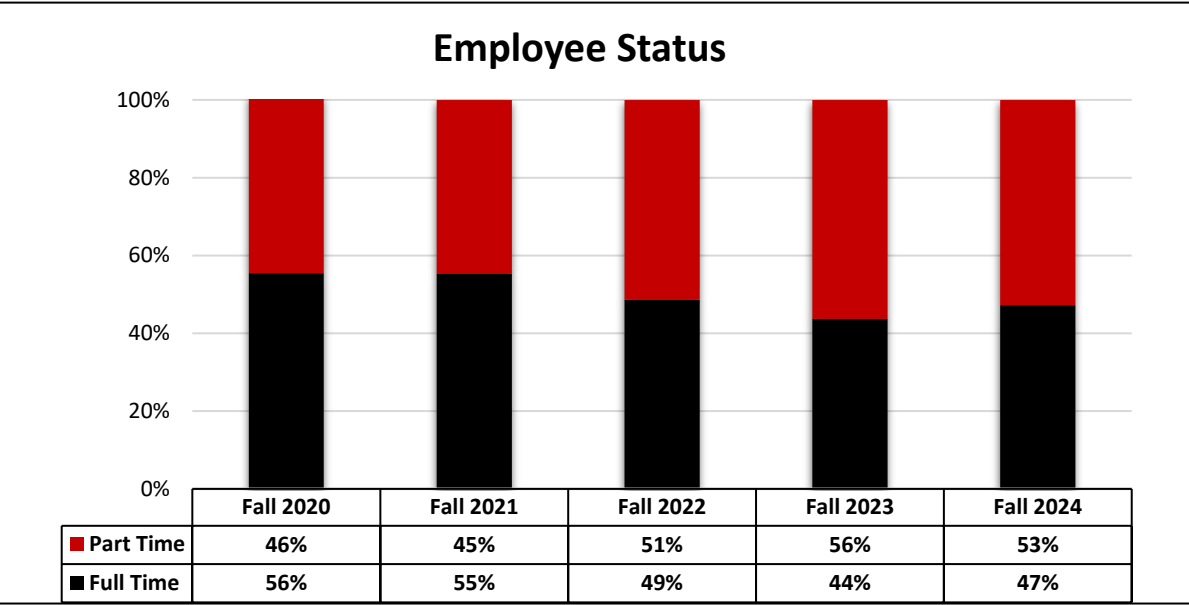
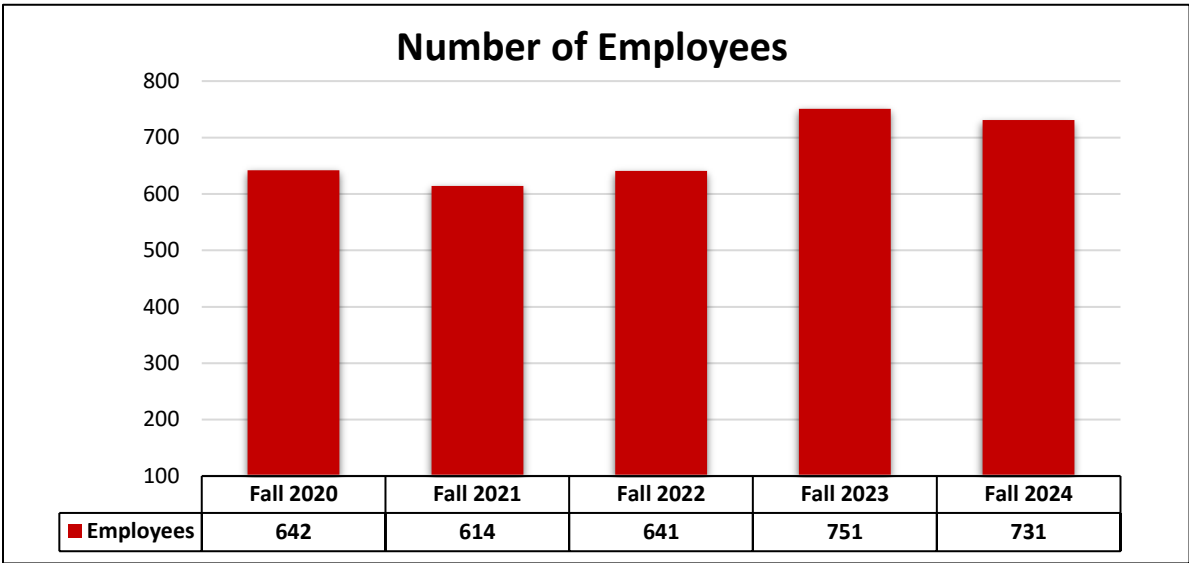
Number of Students Served by
Adult Education & Literacy



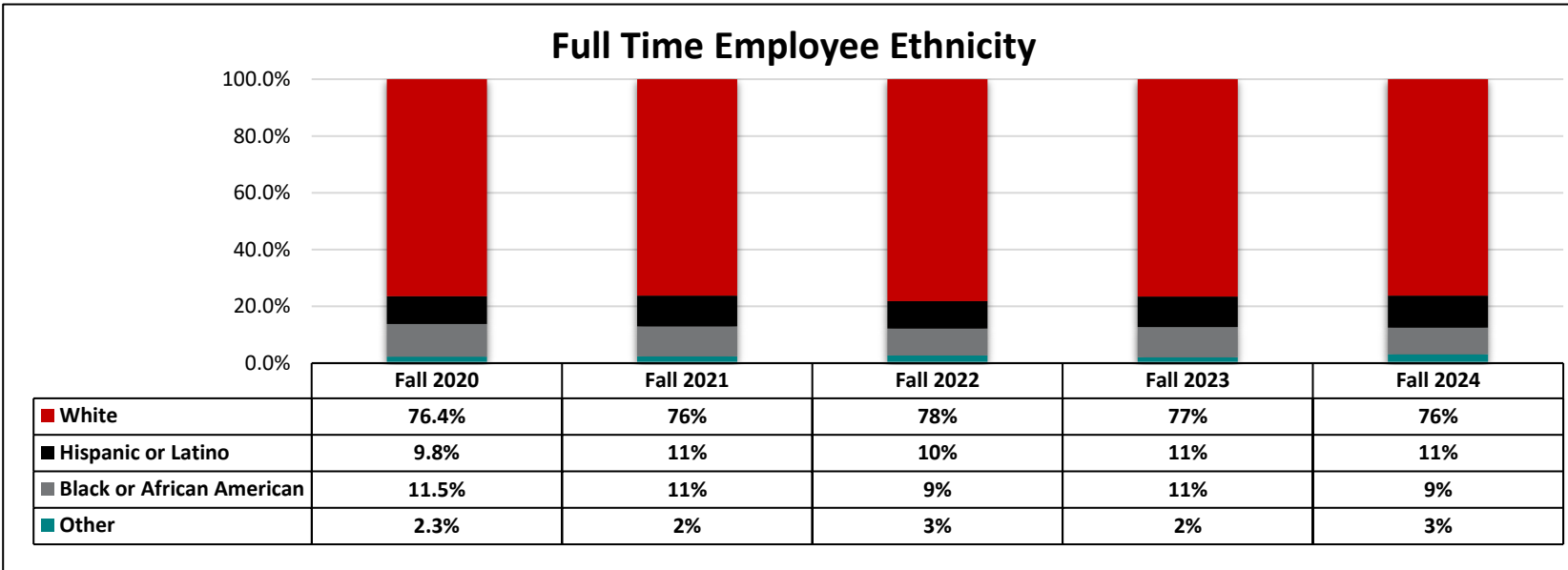
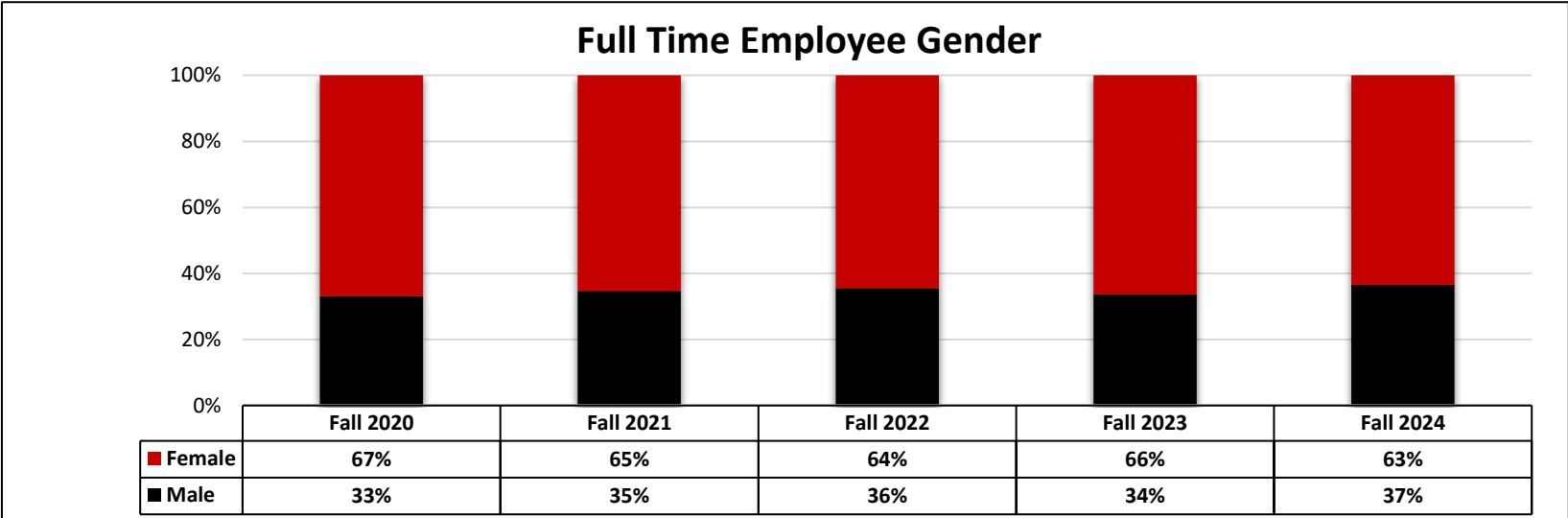

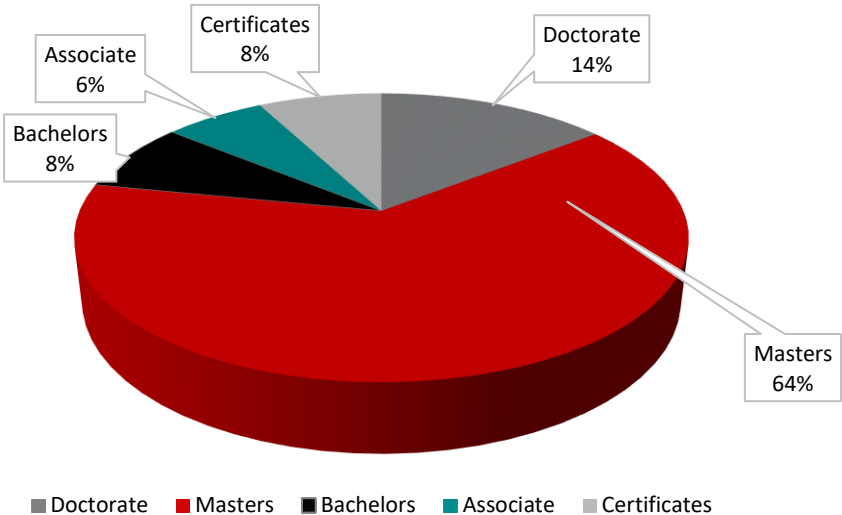

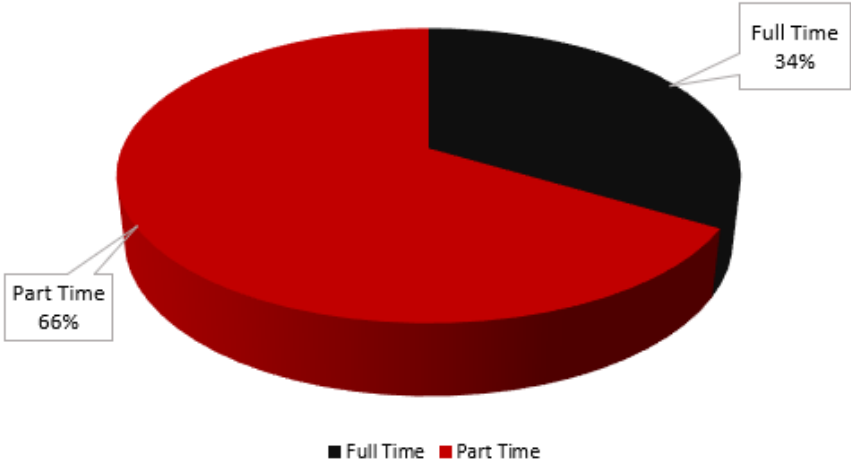

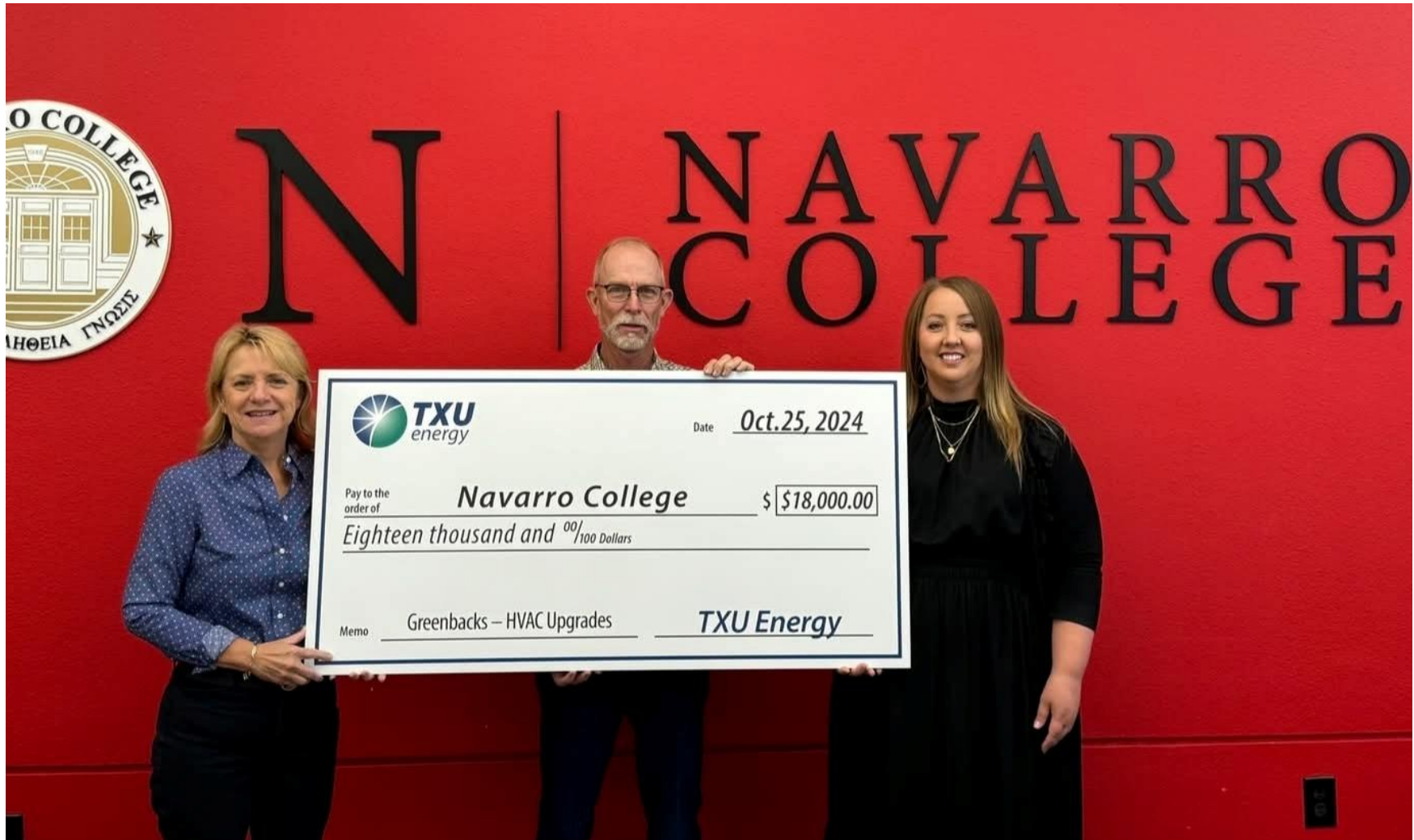
Degrees Held by Faculty



Faculty Status

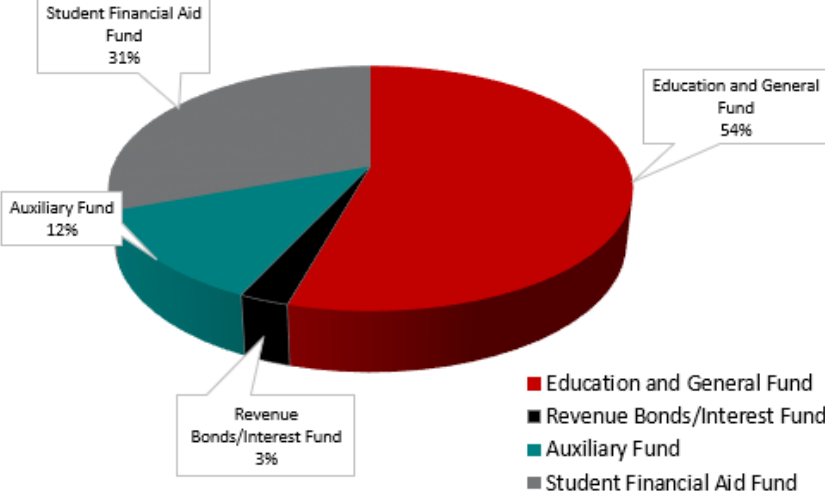

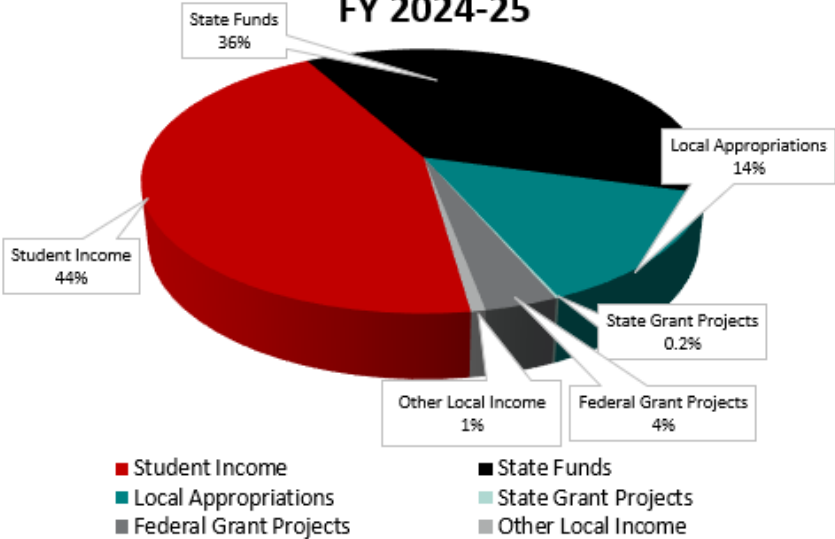

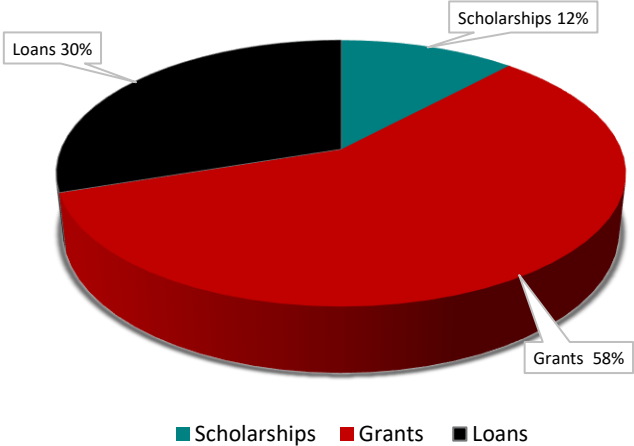
